14	BY THE COMMISSION:
15	FINDINGS OF FACT
16	1. On January 13, 2017, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") issued
17	Decision No. 75919 to begin the process of amending the Arizona Universal Service Fund ("AUSF")
18	rules. Consistent with the Governor's educational initiatives, the Commission, along with the Arizona
19	Department of Education and the Arizona State Library and Archives, is partnering to assist Arizona
20	schools and public libraries to take advantage of a recent and limited program under the Federal
21	Communications Commission's ("FCC's") E-rate program for schools and libraries.
22	Background
23	2. On September 22, 1989, the Commission established the AUSF in Decision No.
24	56639. The AUSF was established to maintain statewide average rates and the availability of basic
25	telephone service to the greatest extent reasonably possible. The Commission entered into an
26	agreement for professional services with Solix, Inc. (formerly the National Exchange Carriers
27	Association) to administer the AUSF.

3. One half of the AUSF funding requirement is collected through a surcharge paid by providers of basic local exchange service, wireless service, paging service and other Commercial Mobile Radio Service providers that interconnect with the public switched network. These entities are known as Category One providers. The second half of the AUSF funding requirement is collected from providers of intrastate toll service. These entities are known as Category Two providers.

6 4. At the end of every year, Solix requests and receives data from all Arizona 7 telecommunications providers for use in calculating the AUSF surcharges for the next year. Once Solix has the information, it determines the amount of the annual AUSF surcharge for the Category 8 One providers on a per access line and per interconnecting trunk line basis for the upcoming year and 9 provides that information to the Commission. It also determines the monthly surcharge for the 10 upcoming year as a percentage of intrastate toll revenues and provides the information to the 11 Commission for Category Two providers. The Commission issues an order approving the surcharge 12 to be billed to the providers' customers. Solix also collects the providers' contributions and uses the 13 money to cover the amount of AUSF distributions that have been authorized by the Commission. 14 Currently, in order for a utility to receive AUSF support, the funding must be authorized by the 15 Commission in a rate case. 16

17 The Commission, through this emergency rulemaking, will be instituting a new 5. program under AUSF to assist Arizona schools and public libraries to fund the necessary broadband 18 facilities to obtain broadband connectivity. Under the FCC's E-rate Modernization Orders1, 19 qualifying schools and libraries are able to obtain, for a limited period of time, federal matching funds 20 21 for broadband special construction projects up to a certain amount, but only if state funds are provided. The program is of limited duration, and expedited action will have to be taken by the 22 Commission in order for the remaining Arizona schools and libraries with limited or no internet 23 connectivity to take advantage of this new program. The amount necessary to be collected under the 24 AUSF for this new program is approximately \$8 million in the aggregate. These funds would be 25

distributed to qualifying entities for up to five years after a determination of eligibility and award of federal funds by the Universal Service Administrative Company ("USAC"), the federal universal service fund administrator.

- 6. In 2015, 37 percent of Arizona school districts lacked internet capabilities consistent
 with the FCC's standard of 100 kilobits per second (0.1 Mbps) per student. Over 63 percent of these
 districts were located in rural Arizona. The bandwidth needs of schools and libraries using digital
 learning are growing exponentially.
- 8 7. On January 13, 2017, the Commission issued Decision No. 75919 which required Staff
 9 to immediately draft appropriate rules, seek stakeholder comment, schedule technical workshops to
 10 discuss stakeholder comments, and determine how best to require companies to notice customers of
 11 those efforts. Subsequently, a Procedural Order was issued requiring affected companies to provide
 12 notice to their customers of the increased surcharge by February 14, 2017.
- 8. Staff docketed draft proposed rules on January 20, 2017. Staff requested informal 13 comment from interested stakeholders by January 27, 2017, and convened an initial workshop to 14 discuss stakeholder comments on January 30, 2017. Additional informal stakeholder comments and 15 reply comments were received on the proposed rules on February 7 and 8, 2017. Based upon the 16 comments received, Staff issued a revised draft of the proposed rules on February 15, 2017. 17 Interested stakeholders were asked to file comments on the revised draft rules by February 28, 2017. 18 The Commission held a second workshop to discuss the revised rules on March 2, 2017. Several 19 revisions have been incorporated into the draft rules included herewith as a result of that workshop. 20
- 21 Recommended Rules
- 9. The recommended rules are included in a new Part B to the current AUSF rules located at Arizona Administrative Code ("A.A.C.") R14-2-1201 *et seq.* The new Part B is entitled "Arizona Universal Service Support for Schools and Libraries." The new R14-2-1218 sets forth the purpose of the proposed rules. R14-2-1219 contains definitions with respect to the proposed rules and incorporates by reference relevant definitions adopted by the FCC related to E-rate federal funding. R14-2-1220 establishes what is covered by the program. R14-2-1221 outlines the steps to be taken by applicants to obtain state funds for special construction projects, which will allow applicants

to qualify for an additional 10 percent in federal matching funds. R14-2-1222 of the proposed rules
 contains provisions relating to the Administrator of the program under the AUSF and carrier
 contributions and disbursements from the fund. Finally, R14-2-1223 contains provisions relating to
 discontinuation of the program since this is a program of limited duration at the federal level.

The Commission received informal comments on the proposed rules from 5 10. stakeholders including Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC; Cox Arizona Telcom; LLC, 6 AT&T Inc.; Smith Bagley, Inc., dba Cellular One of North East Arizona; Frontier Communications 7 and several small rural incumbent local exchange carriers including Arizona Telephone Company, 8 9 Southwestern Telephone Company, Table Top Telephone Company, Inc., Valley Telephone Cooperative, Inc., and Copper Valley Telephone, Inc. The Commission also received a few 10 comments from members of the public. The Commission incorporated many stakeholder comments 11 into its proposed rules, although not all comments. Interested stakeholders will be invited to 12 comment again when the Commission adopts permanent rules. 13

Emergency Rulemaking

15 11. Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S.") § 41-1026 permits an agency to adopt rules on an 16 emergency basis if the agency makes a finding that the rules are necessary as an emergency measure. 17 A.R.S. § 41-1026(A) provides that a rule may be adopted as an emergency measure if the rule is 18 necessary to (1) protect the public health, safety or welfare, (2) comply with deadlines in amendments 19 to an agency's governing law or federal programs, (3) avoid violation of federal law or regulation or 20 other state law, (4) avoid an imminent budget reduction, or (5) avoid serious prejudice to the public 21 interest or the interest of the parties concerned.

12. Adoption of the recommended rules is necessary to comply with deadlines in amendments to a federal program. Additionally, the Commission believes that the emergency rules are necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare; and to avoid serious prejudice to the public interest or the interest of the parties concerned.

26 13. First, the Commission is adopting these rules on an emergency basis in order to
27 comply with the deadlines set by the FCC and the USAC. In order for Arizona applicants to qualify
28 for state and federal matching funds for this funding year, the state rules have to be in place by May

1

11, 2017. Since this program is of limited duration at the federal level, it is critical that Arizona's rules become effective by this date so that applicants can qualify for these funds. As stated previously, the 2 state matching funds make applicants eligible for an extra 10 percent in federal funds. 3

Second, the Commission believes that adoption of these rules will avoid serious 14. prejudice to the public interest or the interest of the parties concerned. The rules will allow for 5 internet connectivity in many rural areas of Arizona where it is lacking, often because the schools and 6 7 public libraries cannot afford to pay the undiscounted portion of the special construction necessary for broadband deployment. If the rules are not adopted on an emergency basis, Arizona schools and libraries will be unable to take advantage of the program in this funding year, which will adversely affect the state's E-rate program ramp-up into the future.

11 15. Third, the Commission also believes that the proposed rules are necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare. Because internet connectivity to schools and libraries is critical to 12 an informed populace and can be used in various ways to protect the public health, safety or welfare, 13 the Commission believes it meets this criteria as well. Additionally, extending broadband service to 14 schools and libraries in remote and underserved areas can make it reasonable economically for a 15 broadband provider to extend service into the community at large. 16

Rules Adopted Pursuant to the Commission's Ratemaking Authority 17

Because this rulemaking establishes an addition to the AUSF surcharge, the 18 16. 19 Commission is adopting these rules pursuant to its exclusive ratemaking authority as set forth in Art. 15, Section 3 of the Arizona Constitution. The Commission additionally has statutory authority to 20 make the revisions, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 40-202, 40-203, and 40-322. 21

22 17. The Commission has determined that the rules to be adopted in the emergency rulemaking are exempt from the Arizona Attorney General certification provisions of the Arizona 23 24 Administrative Procedure Act (A.R.S. § 41-1044) under State ex. rel. Corbin v. Arizona Corporation Commission, 174 Ariz. 216, 848 P.2d 301 (App. 1992). Because the rules are not subject to the Attorney 25 General's certification under A.R.S. § 41-1044, the Commission concludes that the emergency 26 27 rulemaking likewise is not subject to the Attorney General's review and approval under A.R.S. § 41-28 1026.

1	Staff's Recommendations
2	18. Staff recommends that the Commission adopt on an emergency basis, with an
3	immediate effective date as authorized under A.R.S. § 41-1032(A)(1) and (3), the proposed AUSF E-
4	rate broadband special construction project rules, as set forth in the Notice of Emergency Rulemaking
5	attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A.
6	19. Staff further recommends that the Commission direct Staff to immediately submit the
7	Emergency Rulemaking Package that includes Exhibit A and the Economic, Small Business and
8	Consumer Impact Statement ("EIS") included in Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated herein
9	by reference as well as all necessary documents in accordance with A.A.C. R1-1-701.
10	20. We find that the rule revisions included in Exhibit A are necessary as an emergency
11	rule measure.
12	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
13	1. Pursuant to the Arizona Constitution, Article 15, § 3, the Commission has jurisdiction
14	to amend 14 A.A.C. 2, Article 12 as reflected in Exhibit A. The Commission additionally has statutory
15	authority to make the revisions, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 40-202, 40-203, and 40-322.
16	2. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1026, an emergency exists that requires the immediate
17	adoption of the rule revisions set forth in Exhibit A, which are just and reasonable and in the public
18	interest.
19	3. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1032(A)(1) and (3), the Commission has authority to make the
20	rules set forth in Exhibit A effective immediately upon the filing of the Notice of Emergency
21	Rulemaking with the Office of the Secretary of State.
22	4. Staff's recommendations in Findings of Fact Nos. 18 and 19 are appropriate and
23	should be adopted.
24	ORDER
25	IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Commission hereby adopts the text of A.A.C. Title
26	14, Chapter 2, Article 12, as set forth in the Notice of Emergency Rulemaking attached hereto as
27	Exhibit A.

3	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Utilities and Legal Divisions shall prepare and submit
4	to the Secretary of State's Office, for publication in the Arizona Administrative Register, an
5	Emergency Rulemaking Package that includes the Notice of Emergency Rulemaking attached hereto
6	and incorporated herein as Exhibit A along with any additional documents required by the Office of
7	the Secretary of State pursuant to A.A.C. R1-1-701.
8	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission's Utilities Division and Legal Division is
9	authorized to make non-substantive changes in the text of A.A.C. Title 14, Chapter 2, Article 12
10	adopted herein; the Economic Impact Statement adopted herein; and any of the additional documents
11	required by the Office of the Secretary of State, in response to comments received from the Office of
12	the Secretary of State during the certification, publication, and/or codification process, unless the
13	Commission requires otherwise after notification of those changes.

PART B. ARIZONA UNIVERSAL SERVICE SUPPORT FOR SCHOOLS AND LIBRARIES

R14-2-1218. Purpose

The purpose of the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program is to provide state funds for special construction projects involving the deployment of broadband to schools and libraries in Arizona so that

<u>Arizona schools and libraries may obtain federal matching funds under the FCC Universal Service Fund's Schools and Libraries Program. This Part shall be interpreted to maximize the availability of internet access to schools and libraries within Arizona and to maximize potential support from the FCC Universal Service Fund's Schools and Libraries Program to fill any connectivity gap in Arizona.</u>

R14-2-1219. Definitions

In this Part, unless the context otherwise requires, the following definitions shall apply:

- The definitions contained in 47 CFR 54.500 (October 1, 2016), with no future editions or amendments, which are incorporated by reference; on file with the Commission; and published by and available from the U.S. Government Publishing Office, 732 North Capitol Street, NW, Washington, DC 20401-0001 and at https://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/;
- 2. The definitions in R14-2-1201, to the extent applicable; and
- <u>3.</u> <u>The following definitions:</u>
 - a. <u>"Applicant" is a school, library, consortium, or other eligible entity that requests AUSF funds as</u> provided in this Part.

 - <u>c.</u> "Category 1 services" are services used to connect broadband or internet to eligible locations or that provide basic conduit access to the internet, including "telecommunications services," "telecommunications," and "internet access" as defined in 47 CFR 54.5 (October 1, 2016), with no future editions or amendments, which is incorporated by reference; on file with the Commission; and published by and available from the U.S. Government Publishing Office, 732 North Capitol Street, NW, Washington, DC 20401-0001 and at https://www.gpo.gov/fdsys//.
 - d. <u>"Category 2 services" are internal connections services needed to enable high speed broadband</u> connectivity and broadband internal connections components, including local area networks (LAN/WLAN), internal connections components, basic maintenance of internal connections components, and managed internal broadband service.
 - e. <u>"Data Transmission Services and Internet Access" is a Category 1 service type that includes</u> broadband connectivity and basic conduit access to the Internet. This does not include charges for content, equipment purchase, or other services beyond basic conduit access to the internet. This service type also covers lit or dark fiber,

f. "Department of Education" or "DOE" means the Arizona Department of Education.

g. <u>"Discount Calculations" means the discount matrix, determined using the percentage of students</u> eligible for the National School Lunch Program or an equivalent measure of poverty, and the rural or urban status of the school district or library system as determined by the U.S. Census Bureau.

- <u>h.</u> "Eligible provider" means a provider that has a 498 ID also known as a Service Provider
 <u>Identification Number or SPIN, obtained by filing an FCC Form 498.</u>
- <u>"Eligible special construction" or "ESC" refers to special construction projects for Category 1</u> services that deploy new fiber or upgraded facilities to locations eligible for the E-rate Program. ESC may also include non-fiber based services.
- <u>"E-rate Program" is an FCC program that provides discounts to schools and libraries for eligible products and services.</u>
- <u>k</u>. "E-rate Modernization Orders" are the FCC Orders that have modernized the FCC's E-rate Program and have maximized schools' and libraries' options for purchasing affordable high-speed broadband connectivity. Modernizing the E-Rate Program for Schools and Libraries, Connect America Fund, WC Docket No. 13-184, Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking; 29 FCC Rcd 8870 (2014) and Second Report and Order and Order on Reconsideration, 29 FCC Rcd. 15538 (2014).
- <u>1.</u> <u>"Federal Communications Commission" or "FCC" is the U.S. government agency that regulates</u> interstate and international communications and oversees the federal universal service fund.
- <u>m.</u> <u>"FCC Form 470" is the Description of Services Requested and Certification Form that schools and libraries complete to request services and establish eligibility.</u>
- <u>n.</u> <u>"FCC Form 471" is the Services Ordered and Certification Form that schools and libraries use to</u> report services ordered and discounts requested for those services.
- <u>o</u>. <u>"Funding Commitment Decision Letter" or "FCDL" is a letter from USAC to the applicant which</u> <u>contains USAC's funding decisions on the applicant's funding requests.</u>
- <u>p.</u> "Funding Year" or "FY" is a 12-month period during which program support is being provided, beginning on July 1 and ending on June 30 of the following calendar year.
- 9. "Second E-rate Modernization Order" is the FCC Order that modernized the FCC's E-rate Program and provided for additional discounts when states match funds for high-speed broadband connections, Modernizing the E-Rate Program for Schools and Libraries, Connect America Fund, WC Docket No. 13-184 Second Report and Order and Order on Reconsideration, 29 FCC Rcd 15538 (2014).
- <u>r.</u> <u>"Special Construction Charges" are the upfront, non-recurring costs of ESC installations or upgrades, consisting of three components:</u>
 - i. Construction of network facilities,
 - ii. Design and engineering, and
 - iii. Project management.
- <u>s.</u> <u>"Staff designee" is the Director of the Commission's Utilities Division or another individual that</u> the Commission assigns to perform duties under this Part.
- t.
 "Universal Service Administrative Company" or "USAC" is an independent, not-for-profit

 corporation created by the FCC in 1997 to administer the four universal service programs

including universal service for schools and libraries.

- <u>u</u>. <u>"Urban" means an individual school or library that is located in an "Urbanized Area" or "Urban</u> <u>Cluster" with a population of 25,000 or more as determined by the U.S. Census Bureau. All other</u> <u>schools or libraries are designated as "rural".</u>
- <u>v</u>. <u>"Vendor" is the entity that has been selected by the applicant and whose bid USAC has recognized in a FCDL to the applicant.</u>

<u>R14-2-1220.</u> <u>Availability of State Matching Funds for Special Construction Projects to Deploy</u> <u>Broadband</u>

- <u>A.</u> <u>Applications for AUSF funds for E-rate matching purposes shall be limited to E-rate funding years 2017</u> and 2018.
- B. An applicant certified by the Department of Education shall be eligible to receive AUSF funds to cover special construction charges to the extent necessary to qualify the applicant to receive additional federal universal service funds of up to 10 percent of special construction charges as authorized by the Second E-rate Modernization Order.
- C. An applicant may not receive total support from the federal Universal Service Fund and AUSF in excess of 100 percent of special construction charges.
- D. Schools and libraries that elect to self-provision shall comply with all of the requirements set forth by the FCC in the Second E-rate Modernization Order.
- E. <u>An ESC shall provide bandwidth sufficient to meet the minimum recommended bandwidth per student or</u> the minimum recommended bandwidth for educational services established for the relevant funding year by the FCC, and without good cause, shall not exceed those standards.
- F. If the E-rate Program discount share and additional match plus the AUSF funds received by an applicant do not cover 100 percent of the special construction charges, the Applicant may include in its request filed with the DOE, a request for additional AUSF funds. Additional AUSF funds requested under this subsection shall be awarded as follows:
 - 1. Applicants with 80 percent or higher E-rate Program discount rate shall be awarded AUSF funds before applicants with lower discount rates; and
 - 2. Applicants with discount rates between 60-80% may request additional AUSF funds for the uncovered amount up to 50 percent of the uncovered special construction charges. Amounts requested above 50 percent of the uncovered special construction charges, will not be considered without good cause shown by the applicant.

R14-2-1221. Procedures for Requesting State Matching Funds

- A. An applicant shall file a request for state matching funds with the Department of Education, prior to submitting its Form 471 to USAC.
- B. If an applicant meets all FCC eligibility requirements for its ESC, the applicant shall obtain a certification

letter along with a letter from the Department of Education stating that the applicant is being awarded state matching funds.

- <u>C.</u> <u>An applicant shall provide the Staff designee a copy of the certification letter and letter awarding state</u> matching funds to it issued by the Department of Education and shall include a copy of the letter awarding state matching funds with its FCC Form 471 sent to USAC.
- D. Once USAC determines an applicant's eligibility for federal matching funds and issues a FCDL the applicant shall notify the Department of Education and request that the Department of Education submit a letter to the Staff designee and the Administrator indicating that USAC has issued a FCDL to the applicant with an award of federal funds and including any other information relevant to the award in that particular case.
- E. Disbursement of AUSF funds shall be available for a period of up to five years after USAC has issued a FCDL to the applicant with an award of federal funds, notwithstanding R14-2-1220(A).
- **F.** If USAC reduces or rescinds an applicant's award of federal matching funds following an audit, investigation, enforcement action, or consent decree, the applicant shall immediately notify the Department of Education and the Staff designee and shall reimburse the AUSF fund for any amount by which the AUSF funds received exceeded the federal matching funds award retained.

R14-2-1222. Administrator Responsibilities; Contributions to and Disbursements from the AUSF

- A. The Administrator shall be responsible for administering the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program and, in doing so, shall comply with R14-2-1211 and R14-2-1214.
- B. <u>The Administrator shall:</u>
 - 1.
 Determine the surcharge rates to fund the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project

 Matching Fund Program, subject to Commission approval;
 - 2. Obtain surcharge collections; and
 - 3. <u>Make disbursements from the AUSF for state matching funds as authorized by the Department of</u> Education and the Commission or its Staff designee, as provided in this Section.
- C. The increase to the existing surcharge to fund the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program shall be separately calculated and implemented in accordance with Sections R14-2-1204, R14-2-1205(B) through (E), R14-2-1206 (A) through (C), and R14-2-1207.
- D. E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program surcharges shall not be collected for a period longer than 12 months unless the surcharge collections from carriers in that 12 month period do not produce \$8 million in total funding. If the amount collected is less than the \$8 million cap, the increase in the AUSF surcharge for this Program shall continue until the \$8 million cap is reached. If the collections produce more than \$8 million in the 12 month period, the Commission Staff shall make a recommendation to the Commission regarding the disposition of the over-collected funds,
- E. <u>A telecommunications service provider may collect the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project</u> <u>Matching Fund Program surcharges from its customers in any manner it reasonably determines to be best</u>

for its business and its customers, but shall not in the aggregate collect more than that authorized by the Commission. The telecommunications service providers shall report and submit payment of assessments according to the schedule established by the Administrator.

- F. Within 30 days from the effective date of these rules, each telecommunications service provider that interconnects to the public switched network shall provide a letter to the Administrator acknowledging the telecommunications service provider's obligation to pay the new E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program surcharges authorized in this Part. Failure to provide such a letter may be grounds for denying the service provider interconnection with the public switched network, upon notice and opportunity to be heard before the Commission
- G. An applicant shall:
 - 1.
 After accepting an eligible provider's bid for an ESC, notify within 15 days the Department of Education and the Administrator of the bid amount accepted so that the Administrator may allocate funds for the ESC; and
 - 2. After the vendor completes the project, submit to the Department of Education and Administrator a request for disbursement of the funds allocated for the ESC.
- **H.** The Administrator shall disburse AUSF funds allocated for an applicant's ESC upon approval from the Commission or its Staff designee.

R14-2-1223. Discontinuation of E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program

- A. Nó applications for the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program shall be accepted after the 2018 E-rate FY procurement cycle.
- B. Except as provided in subsection (C), the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program shall be discontinued when all of the funds have been collected and all of the funds collected have been disbursed.
- C. The E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program may be discontinued earlier or later than specified in subsection (B) if required by the FCC or USAC.

B. <u>Economic, Small Business and Consumer Impact Statement</u>

1. Identification of the proposed rule making.

In partnership with the Department of Education, the Governor's Office, and the Arizona State Library and Archives, the purpose of the proposed rules are to amend Article 12: Arizona Universal Service Fund R14-2-1201, *et al.* to add new sections beginning with R14-2-1218. The new sections will expand the Arizona Universal Service Fund for the purpose of providing state matching funds for special construction projects as provided for in the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") E-rate Modernization Orders to facilitate the construction of broadband infrastructure to schools and libraries in largely rural areas in Arizona. The new rule sections will provide the authorization and method for telecommunications service providers to collect the funds required from customers and the administration of disbursements from the fund.

2. <u>Persons who will be directly affected by, bear the costs of, or directly benefit</u> from the proposed rule making.

- a. customers of telecommunications service providers in Arizona;
- b. telecommunications service providers in Arizona;
- c. businesses involved in construction of broadband infrastructure or provision of broadband services;
- d. The administrator of the AUSF, Solix, Inc.;
- e. Arizona Department of Education;
- f. schools and libraries in largely rural areas in Arizona; and
- g. Arizona Corporation Commission.

3. <u>Cost-benefit analysis.</u>

a. <u>Probable costs and benefits to the implementing agency and other</u> <u>agencies directly affected by the implementation and enforcement of</u> <u>the proposed rule making.</u>

Probable costs to the Commission of the proposed rulemaking would include Staff's time associated with reviewing authorization forms for special construction projects and the administration of the new funds. Potential benefits to the Commission include the expansion of communications services to the rural parts of Arizona that may have

limited connectivity or no broadband access available. It is not anticipated that any new full-time employees are needed to implement the proposed rules.

Probable costs to other agencies (i.e. Department of Education), could be an increase in the internal Staff's administrative process and the number of special construction project requests to be processed and reviewed. Potential benefits to the Department of Education include the opportunity to further its mission in ensuring every student has access to an excellent education.

b. <u>Probable costs and benefits to a political subdivision of this state</u> <u>directly affected by the implementation and enforcement of the</u> <u>proposed rule making.</u>

To the extent that political subdivisions of this state are customers of telecommunications service providers, the political subdivisions would be required to pay the increased surcharge required by the amended rules. Probable benefits to political subdivisions would include improved education to students and members of the communities, potentially creating a stronger workforce and further economic development.

c. <u>Probable costs and benefits to businesses directly affected by the</u> <u>proposed rule making, including any anticipated effect on the</u> <u>revenues or payroll expenditures of employers who are subject to the</u> <u>proposed rule making.</u>

Business customers of telecommunications service providers will be required to pay an increase in their monthly Arizona Universal Service Fund surcharge in order to fund the approved special construction projects. Benefits directly related to businesses associated with the rule making include the opportunity for a stronger workforce. Individuals who may not otherwise have access to the internet or the ability to apply for jobs will now have that option thus benefiting the economy and business growth in Arizona. Payroll expenditures of telecommunications service providers will not likely be affected. Revenues of telecommunications service providers should not be impacted as a result of the amended rules because the costs will be passed through to their customers in the form of an increased surcharge. The Administrator of the AUSF, Solix, Inc., will see an increase in personnel time expended for administration of the AUSF program for the duration of the E-rate Broadband Special Construction Project Matching Fund Program. Businesses involved in construction of broadband infrastructure or the provision of broadband services are likely to see an increase in business as a result of new construction projects, particularly in rural areas.

4. <u>Probable impact on private and public employment in businesses, agencies, and political subdivisions of this state directly affected by the proposed rule making.</u>

Private and public employment in businesses, agencies, and political subdivisions of this state may increase as a result of the proposed rulemaking. More local contractors may be needed to build special construction projects or restaurants and hotels may need increased staff to accommodate outside contractors.

5. Probable impact of the proposed rule making on small businesses.

a. <u>Identification of the small businesses subject to the proposed rule</u> making.

To the extent that small businesses are customers of telecommunications service providers, the small businesses would be required to pay the increased surcharge required by the amended rules. The proposed rules would also apply to telecommunications service providers, some of whom may be small businesses.

b. <u>Administrative and other costs required for compliance with the</u> proposed rule making.

Small businesses could incur minimal additional administrative costs related to the increased surcharge. The changes to the rules do not create any other new cost obligations.

c. <u>A description of the methods that the agency may use to reduce the impact on small businesses.</u>

Not applicable.

d. <u>Probable cost and benefit to private persons and consumers who are</u> <u>directly affected by the proposed rule making.</u>

Private persons who are customers of telecommunications service providers will be required to pay an increase in their monthly Arizona Universal Service Fund surcharge in order to fund the approved special construction projects. Potential benefits to private persons include the increased access to broadband service in libraries. Those who may not have service in their homes may now have the ability to use the internet at their local library for whatever purpose they may need. Additionally, the impact this will have on children who will be given the opportunity for an excellent education will benefit the community as a whole for years to come.

6. <u>Probable effect on state revenues.</u>

The rule changes are not expected to have any impact on state revenues.

7. <u>Less intrusive or less costly alternative methods of achieving the purpose of the proposed rule making.</u>

The Commission is unaware of any alternative methods of achieving the purpose of the rulemaking that would be less intrusive or less costly.

8. Description of any data on which the rule is based.

The 2016 State of the States Report from the EducationSuperHighway indicates Arizona has 23% of its school districts meeting the affordable broadband criteria. Only 6% meet the minimum recommended bandwidth per student as determined by the State Educational Technology Directors Association ("SETDA") and the FCC.

C. <u>If for any reason adequate data are not reasonably available to comply with the</u> requirements of subsection B of this section, the agency shall explain the limitations of the data and the methods that were employed in the attempt to obtain the data and shall characterize the probable impacts in qualitative terms.

Data is available as described above in B (8).
