### **Commission Adds APS Public Comment Hearing in Flagstaff**

(Phoenix) The Arizona Corporation Commission is adding a fifth Public Comment Hearing for the Arizona Public Service Company in its rate application. The hearing will take place April 3<sup>rd</sup> in Flagstaff at 6:00 p.m. at the Flagstaff City Hall, City Council Chambers 211 West Aspen Avenue.

“I want to thank Commissioner Doug Little for expressing his interest in holding this meeting and being a champion of the people of Flagstaff,” said Chairman Tom Forese. “His support is appreciated and I agree that this meeting will offer great value to the citizens and the Commission.”

“I scheduled this public comment session with the help of Flagstaff public officials because I am very interested in hearing from Flagstaff constituents on this matter,” said Commissioner Bob Burns.

Public Comment Hearings were held in Douglas and in Phoenix earlier this month. Another one will be held in Clarkdale on March 29<sup>th</sup> at Yavapai College on the Verde Valley Campus at 601 Black Hills Drive Building M, Room 137. The last will be held in Yuma on April 10 at 6 p.m. at the Historic Yuma Theatre at 254 S. Main Street.

*Established by Article 15 of the state’s constitution, the Arizona Corporation Commission is responsible for the regulation of public utilities, overseeing the incorporation or registration of companies wishing to do business in Arizona. Additionally, the Corporation Commission registers and oversees securities offerings and dealers, and enforces railroad and pipeline safety. The five commissioners that make up the Commission are elected by the people of Arizona for a four-year term, with the option of serving for two consecutive terms.
