16 Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the
17 general public, the parties, and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting
18 Committee (“Committee”), that the Committee will hold a public meeting/hearing on the
19 above application that is open to the public at the Hampton Inn and Suites by Hilton –
20 Phoenix, Goodyear at 2000 North Litchfield Road, Goodyear, Arizona 85395,
21 commencing on January 13, 2025, at 1:00 p.m., and will continue each weekday on
22 January 14, 2025, through January 17, 2025, as necessary, at the same location beginning
23 at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour is taken. If a tour is taken, it will begin on an
24 alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee (“Chairman”).

25 Public comment will be taken in a special evening session on January 13, 2025, at
26 5:30 p.m. and may be taken at the beginning of each hearing day or at other times during
27 the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. Unless later ordered by the Chairman,
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1 the hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day, except on January 13, 2025,
2 when it will continue after 5:30 p.m. for the public comment session.

3 No tour of the Project area is planned by the Chairman at this time. If the
4 Chairman or Committee later decides to conduct a tour, notice that includes a map and
5 itinerary of any such tour will be available at the hearing and posted on the Project website
6 at www.HarquahalaFlatsEnergyStorage.com and the Arizona Corporation Commission's
7 ("ACC") website at: <https://www.azcc.gov/arizona-power-plant/meeting-schedule>.

8 The hearing may conclude earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the
9 number of parties that intervene, the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public
10 comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public
11 meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and,
12 at the discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed project area as set
13 forth above.

14 **THE PUBLIC HAS THE OPTION TO PARTICIPATE BY EITHER**
15 **WATCHING THE MEETING ONLINE OR LISTENING TO THE MEETING VIA**
16 **TELEPHONE.**

17 At least 24 hours in advance of the hearing, information regarding online and
18 telephone hearing access as well as any additional details regarding safety protocols or
19 other revisions to the hearing schedule, will be posted on the Applicant's Project website
20 at www.HarquahalaFlatsEnergyStorage.com and ACC's website at
21 <https://www.azcc.gov/arizona-power-plant/meeting-schedule>. The Chairman may, at his
22 discretion, recess the hearing to a time and place to be announced during the hearing, or to
23 be determined after the recess. The date, time, and place at which the hearing will be
24 resumed will be posted on the above-noted Project and ACC websites. **NOTE: NOTICE**
25 **OF ANY SUCH RESUMED HEARING WILL BE GIVEN; HOWEVER,**
26 **PUBLISHED NOTICE OF SUCH A RESUMED HEARING IS NOT REQUIRED.**

2 **85395. PUBLIC COMMENT MAY ALSO BE TAKEN AT OTHER TIMES**

4 **CHAIRMAN.**

5 **PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT ALL LOCAL AND STATE PUBLIC**

11 At the public meeting/hearing, the Committee may consider, discuss, deliberate
12 and/or vote on the matters on the agenda. Items on the agenda may be taken in a different
13 order than listed as conditions require:

- 14 1. Call to order;
- 15 2. Roll call;
- 16 3. Consideration of and vote upon any requests to intervene;
- 17 4. Hearing on the application;
- 18 5. Public comment at the discretion of the Chairman;
- 19 6. Discussion of potential value of a tour of the proposed route;
- 20 7. If it is decided a tour would be valuable, the Committee will meet at the
21 hearing site. The members of the Committee will tour the project. Members
22 of the public may follow the Committee's tour. No testimony or discussion
23 with or between Committee members about the application or matters
24 relating to the application will take place, except on the record before a court
25 reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural
26 decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
- 27 8. Discussion of proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of
28 environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of
environmental compatibility;


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9. Vote and decision concerning findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of environmental compatibility;
