

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the 17 general public, the parties, and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting 18 Committee ("Committee"), that the Committee will hold a public meeting/hearing on the 19 above application that is open to the public at Beales Celebrations, located at 201 North 4th 20 Street, Kingman, Arizona 86401, commencing on February 3, 2025, at 1:00 p.m., and will 21 continue each weekday on February 4, 2025, through February 7, 2025, as necessary, at 22 the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour is taken. If a tour is 23 taken, it will begin on an alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee 24 ("Chairman"). 25

No tour of the Project area is planned by the Chairman at this time. If the Chairman or Committee later decides to conduct a tour, notice that includes a map and itinerary of any such tour will be available at the hearing and posted on the Project website at <u>https://www.uesaz.com/black-mountain/</u> and the Arizona Corporation Commission's
 ("ACC") website at: <u>https://www.azcc.gov/arizona-power-plant/meeting-schedule</u>.

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Public comment will be taken in a special evening session on February 3, 2025, at 5:30 p.m. and may be taken at the beginning of each hearing day or at other times during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. Unless later ordered by the Chairman, the hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day, except on February 3, 2025, when it will continue after 5:30 p.m. for the public comment session.

8 The hearing may conclude earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the 9 number of parties that intervene, the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public 10 comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public 11 meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and, 12 at the discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed project area as set 13 forth above.

14 THE PUBLIC HAS THE OPTION TO PARTICIPATE BY EITHER 15 WATCHING THE MEETING ONLINE OR LISTENING TO THE MEETING VIA 16 TELEPHONE.

At least 24 hours in advance of the hearing, information regarding online and 17 telephone hearing access as well as any additional details regarding safety protocols or 18 other revisions to the hearing schedule, will be posted on the Applicant's Project website 19 20 at https://www.uesaz.com/black-mountain/ and ACC's website at https://www.azcc.gov/arizona-power-plant/meeting-schedule. The Chairman may, at his 21 discretion, recess the hearing to a time and place to be announced during the hearing, or to 22 be determined after the recess. The date, time, and place at which the hearing will be 23 resumed will be posted on the above-noted Project and ACC websites.
