5 9:00 a.m. each day, only as necessary to complete the hearing.

11 hearing site. The members of the Committee will tour the project.
12 Members of the public may follow the Committee's tour. No testimony or
13 discussion with or between Committee members about the application of
14 matters relating to the application will take place, except on the record
15 before a court reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make
16 any procedural decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
- 17 8. Vote and decision concerning whether to grant Applicant a Certificate of
18 Environmental Compatibility for the Project including findings of fact and
19 conclusions of law;
- 20 9. Adjournment.
