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Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the general public, the parties and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee (“Committee”), that the Committee will hold a public meeting/hearing on the above application that is open to the public at GreenTree Inn & Suites located at 240 West Arizona SR 287, Florence, Arizona 85132, commencing on Monday, April 11, 2022, at 1:00 p.m., and will continue each weekday on Tuesday, April 12, 2022, through April 14, 2022, as necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour is taken. If a tour is taken, it will begin on an alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee (“Chairman”). Public comment may be taken at the beginning of each hearing day or at other times during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman.

The hearing may conclude earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the number of parties that intervene, the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and, at the discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed project area as set forth above.

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
1 At the public meeting/hearing, the Committee may consider, discuss, deliberate
2 and/or vote on the matters on the agenda. Items on the agenda may be taken in a different
3 order than listed as conditions require:

- 4 1. Call to order;
- 5 2. Roll call;
- 6 3. Consideration of and vote upon any requests to intervene;
- 7 4. Hearing on the application;
- 8 5. Public comment at the discretion of the Chairman;
- 9 6. Discussion of potential value of a tour of the proposed route;
- 10 7. If it is decided a tour would be valuable, the Committee will meet at the
11 hearing site. The members of the Committee will tour the project. Members
12 of the public may follow the Committee's tour. No testimony or discussion
13 with or between Committee members about the application or matters
14 relating to the application will take place, except on the record before a court
15 reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural
16 decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
- 17 8. Discussion of proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of
18 environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of
19 environmental compatibility;
- 20 9. Vote and decision concerning findings of fact, conclusions of law, the
21 certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of
22 environmental compatibility;
- 23 10. Adjournment.
