If a tour is taken, it will begin on September 6, 2017, at approximately 9:00 a.m. or an alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee ("Chairman"). Public comment will be taken in a special

1 evening session on September 5, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. and may be taken at the  
2 beginning of each hearing day or at other times during the hearing at times designated  
3 by the Chairman. Unless later ordered by the Chairman, the hearing will adjourn at  
4 approximately 5:00 p.m. each day.

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6 The hearing will thereafter commence at the Desert Diamond Casino & Hotel,  
7 7350 South Nogales Highway, Tucson, AZ 85756, on September 7, 2017, at 9:00 a.m.  
8 and will continue on September 8, 2017, beginning at 9:00 a.m., unless a tour is taken.  
9 If a tour is taken, it will begin on September 7, 2017, at approximately 9:00 a.m. or an  
10 alternative date and time set by the Chairman. Public comment will be taken in a  
11 special evening session on September 7, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. and may be taken at the  
12 beginning of each hearing day or at other times during the hearing at times designated

No testimony or discussion with or between Committee members about the application or matters relating to the application will take place, except on the record before a court reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
8. Discussion of proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of environmental compatibility;
9. Vote and decision concerning findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of environmental compatibility; and
10. Adjournment.
