14 Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the
15 general public, the parties and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting
16 Committee (“Committee”), that the Committee will hold a public meeting/hearing on the
17 above application that is open to the public at the Doubletree Hotel, located at 445 S.
18 Alvernon Way, Tucson, AZ 85711, commencing on September 13, 2021 at 1:00 p.m., and
19 will continue each weekday on September 14, 2021 through September 17, 2021, as
20 necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour is taken.
21 If a tour is taken, it will begin on Wednesday, September 15, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. or an
22 alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee (“Chairman”). If
23 necessary, the hearing will thereafter continue on September 20, 2021, beginning at 1:00
24 p.m. and will continue on September 21, 2021 through September 24, 2021, commencing
25 at 9:00 a.m. each day as necessary.

26 The hearing may conclude earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the
27 number of parties that intervene, the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public
28 comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public

1 meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and,
2 at the discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed project area as set
3 forth above.

16 relating to the application will take place, except on the record before a court
17 reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural
18 decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
- 19 8. Discussion of proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of
20 environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of
21 environmental compatibility;
- 22 9. Vote and decision concerning findings of fact, conclusions of law, the
23 certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of
24 environmental compatibility;
- 25 10. Adjournment.

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
